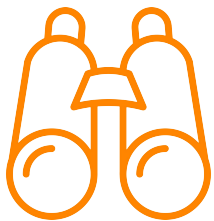

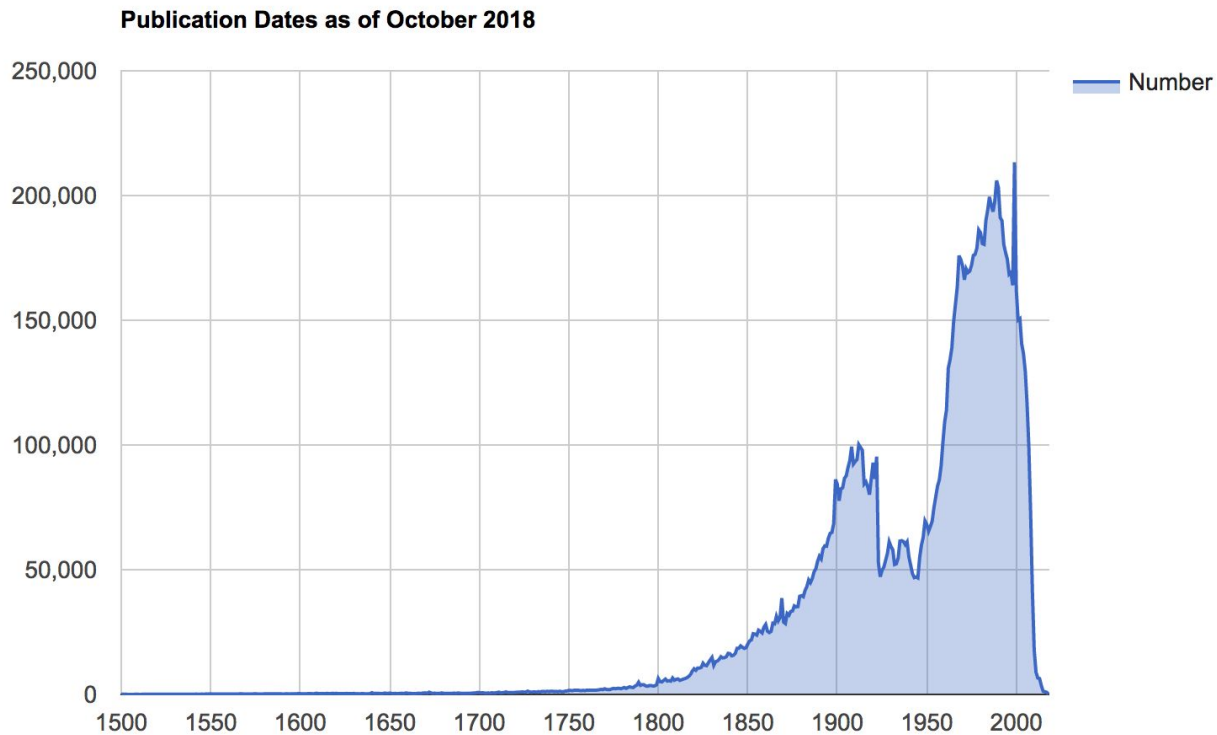

It May Be The Only One

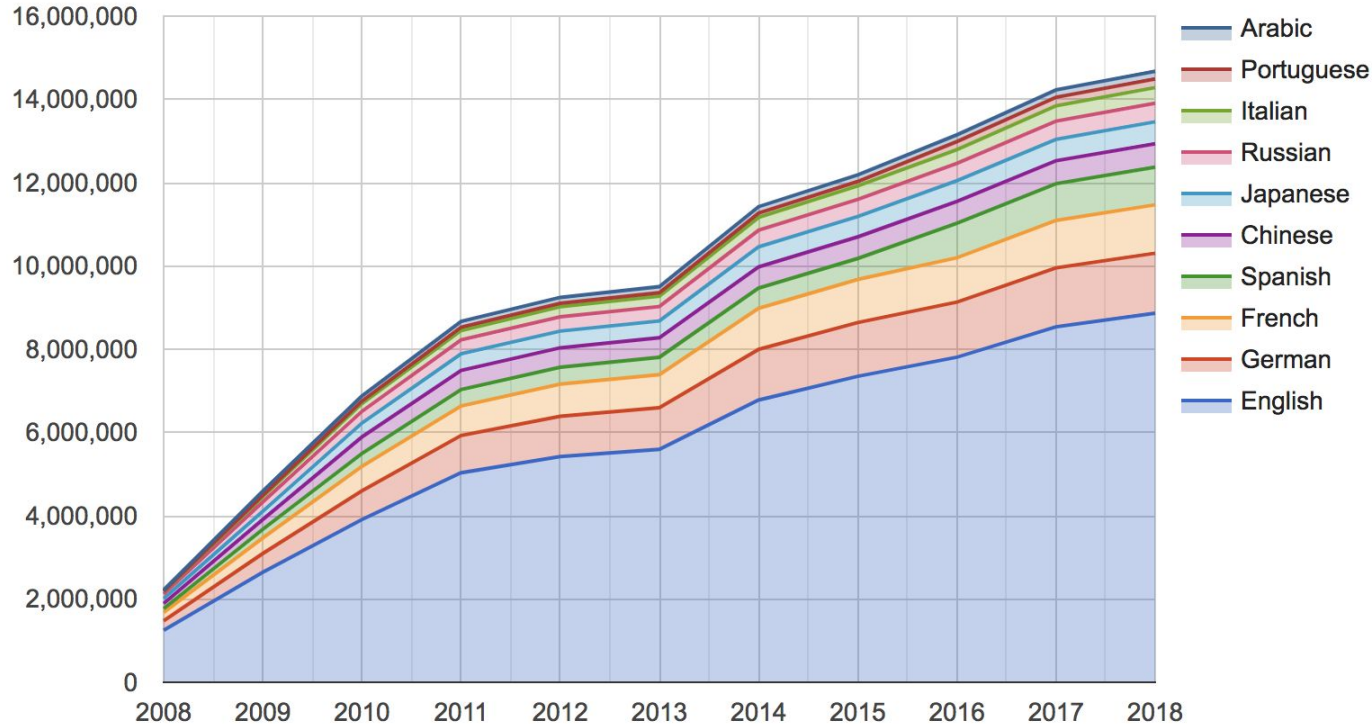


- Rare items from special collections make up a portion of HathiTrust corpus.

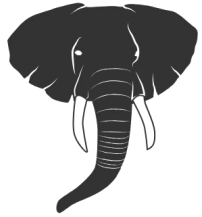

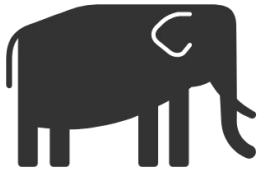

- Search full-text on only those items



Common Question: *Why can't I view this book?*

- It's protected by copyright, and NO ONE can view it in full as per copyright law
- OR: We don't know the copyright status and don't have the resources/expertise to determine the status
- OR: A cataloging problem prevents us from displaying it properly

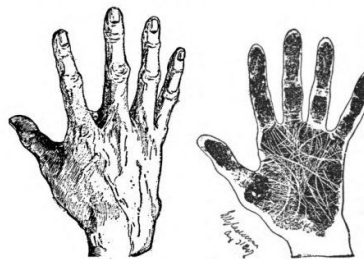
